

Pastor's Message for April

As we contemplate Easter and the message of the resurrection of our Lord, we remember that before there is new life there is death.

"Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit."

(John 12:24 NRSV)!

Most families have a particular month that is very significant in their history. Personally, I have 3 members of my family whose birthdays fall in the month of April.

Such that I call it our "birthday month". A time to celebrate God's precious gift of life, as I remember those who are still with us and those who have passed. I believe we remain connected to those we miss, birthdays remind us of our lost loved ones as time marches us forward, without those we miss.

I am reminded not only of my family members birthdays, but also of the life, death and resurrection of our Lord. Sometimes the day of resurrection falls in March, but most years it's in April. The observance is about the movement of the stars, but our Birthdays are based upon our general calendar whose only variation is 29 days in February every 4 years.

Regardless of how we count the days we are uniquely tied to time. Specific days will bring us memories that haunt us, enlighten us, sadden us, and cause us joy and celebration.

Adult Sunday School - April



Our Spring Quarter theme, **JESUS CALLS US**, focuses on lessons entitled "**Experiencing the Resurrection**". Last month we discussed how Jesus disregarded artificial social barriers and this month we grapple with the fears that creep into our life of faith. While we live in God's kingdom on earth and pray for its fullness "on earth as it is in heaven", our hope is for nothing if Jesus has not been raised from the dead. As amazing as his resurrection was, we must remember how difficult it was for Jesus' disciples to grasp that Jesus was raised back to life —and how difficult it must have been to continue to follow him. In 1968, little-known film director George Romero made a splash into American Pop-Culture with the release of his black-and-white horror movie, *Night of the Living Dead*. The low-budget movie is the story of young couple, who try to survive the night in a Pennsylvania farmhouse, as they are being attacked by a legion of zombie-like dead people who have somehow come back to life. After a decade, the movie had so captivated the culture that it had grossed a whopping \$42 million dollar. For some people, the story of the resurrection of Jesus Christ may sound a little like a strange piece of fiction.

The Bible's account of the resurrection of Jesus is an amazing claim. Nevertheless, based on the testimony of Scripture, and the witness of the Holy Spirit, the Church has for 2,000 years affirmed the doctrine that Jesus Christ rose from the dead on the third day. In Luke 24, we find the story of one of Christ's appearances to His disciples after His resurrection. When He showed up in their meeting, they were shocked and scared. The living Lord asked them, "Why are ye troubled? And why do thoughts arise in your hearts?"

Think about some famous person who died recently, someone whose death made every newspaper and television news broadcast. Imagine a few days later as you watch your favorite news station, a breaking news alert interrupts. The anchor explains that this famous person has come back to life! As you change the channel, you discover this news is the subject on every station. You go to work and everyone is talking about it. You browse the internet, and everyone is posting and blogging about it. This is monumental. This is impossible. This has never happened before! Or has it?

If we aren't in awe of the resurrection of Jesus as a historical event, we may only see it as a fairytale. The resurrection is scientifically impossible, but historically true. As the newly resurrected Lord talked with His



amazed and wide-eyed disciples. He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

As followers of Jesus, as those who believe in His death and resurrection, we have a calling. We have been called to be the witnesses for Jesus and spread the Good News of salvation. And like the disciples we should respond and live out our calling in worship and with joy. Join us in April as we discuss what it means to "Experience the Resurrection".


Study Text: Luke 24:1–12

Some Good News

In the early months of 2020, people around the world were desperate to receive some good news. Shutdowns related to the coronavirus pandemic had begun,



More than "Do No Harm"

My work as a hospital chaplain allows me to observe firsthand to the dedication of the hospital's employees. They prepare treatments, clean rooms, bring food, and provide comfort to patients and their families. The workload is difficult, but the staff rarely complain. These caretakers go above and beyond the health-care principle of "Do no harm." They achieve this by giving individualized care, no matter how long the patient's stay. While death—the greatest physical harm—had come to Jesus, the women wanted to care for his body. For the women at the tomb, the angels brought true good news. Jesus had defeated death as he had been raised from the dead. As a result, he is now the resurrected King who rules over all creation. Although other disciples initially doubted the women's witness, those same disciples would eventually see their resurrected Lord. As they received and believed in that good news, they were called to proclaim it to the whole world. The good news of the resurrection began with the women's witness and went out to all nations. We believers have a role to play in proclaiming that very same good news! Followers of Jesus are called to proclaim the good news of Jesus' resurrection to the world. Are you merely believing in that good news, or are you also proclaiming that good news to the world?

She Is Not Here

I had been overtaken by fear: my young daughter had gone missing. She had accompanied me and my husband to our jobs at college. We had left her in the college's student center. However, as the afternoon turned to evening, she was no longer there. A quick search of the student center and the surrounding buildings revealed nothing—we had lost her! I panicked and fearfully considered all possible outcomes. About that time, I opened the door to a small conference room and found her there, writing on a whiteboard. I can't describe my relief as we made our way back home that evening. Imagine the women's fear and panic when they saw that Jesus' body was no longer in the tomb. The angels' promise to the fearful women remains just as true to us today: Jesus *is* risen!
