Valentine's Day

The Feast of Saint Valentine is celebrated on February 14. lt was originally a Christian feast day honoring a martyr named Valentine. Folk traditions have made it a cultural, religious and commercial celebration of love.



The day became associated with romantic love in the 14 & 15 hundreds when notions of courtly love flourished, apparently by association with the "lovebirds" of early spring. In 18th century England, it grew into an occasion for couples to express their love for each other by presenting flowers, offering confectionery, and sending greeting cards (known as "valentines"). Other customs in England include a character called 'Jack' Valentine who knocks on the rear door of houses leaving sweets and presents for children. Although he leaves treats, many children are scared of this mystical person!



<u>Fellowship Planning</u>



Adult Sunday School – February

We will be considering **The Righteous Live by Faith** in our Sunday School lessons in February. The final lessons in our winter theme, **Faith That Pleases God** highlight the role of faith in challenging situations. The prophet Isaiah encouraged Israel to consider how creation reveals God's power. The all-powerful God who created everything is worthy of receiving our trust, even when we may feel insignificant.

Living with faith does not mean we will never face trials. Instead, living with faith means trusting that the God of creation will never leave us. After Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego refused the king's command to worship an image of gold, they were thrown into the flaming furnace They had confidence that God would be faithful to them, even

if he chose not to save them. In the same way, Daniel demonstrated a life of faith as he continued in prayer, even though doing so might have significantly cost him. He trusted in God's power, even when grave consequences seemed inevitable. When life's hardships overwhelm us or when we can't make sense of the world, Scripture tells us that "the righteous person will live by his faithfulness". God's people are marked by their faith, even in situations that seem entirely out of control. Our lessons in February are entitled...

As we know, life isn't always a bed of roses. Sometimes it's tough, it's scary, it's downright intimidating. But we're not alone in this. Jesus is right there with us. He's got our back, no matter how dark it gets. Robert Schuller was famous for his saying (and book) "Tough Times Never Last, But Tough People Do." We don't always feel tough enough to endure through them. When Moses was called, he pleaded, "Lord, please! Send someone else." It's easy to have faith in God and trust him when we're sitting on top of the world. But the truth is that there are times when we will identify with Job.

Every believer is challenged! A deeply devoted relationship to God does not exempt us from going through the



tough times that come either through the natural course of events or as the result of someone else's sinful actions. Trusting in God in tough times requires faith, courage, and a deep understanding of His love for us. It's about believing that God is bigger than our problems, and that He has a plan for us even when we can't see it. The story of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego is a perfect example of this. They understood that their faith in God was more important than their fear of death. They knew that God was with them, even in the midst of their trials. They stood firm in their faith. They relyied on God's Word to guide them through life's challenges.

Jesus said in John 16:33, "In this world, you WILL have trouble..." So the question is: Are we ready for the tough times when they come into our lives? When the next hurricane

or earthquake hits, the next bad doctor's report comes in, the next family crisis or job loss comes, the next time our sense of support, safety & security is gone, will we be ready? Join us in February as we conclude **The Righteous Live by Faith** and discuss a **Faith That Pleases God** and how God is reaching out to you.



(Thoughts to consider in the upcoming week.)

Study Texts: Isaiah 40:12–31

KEY VERSE: He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. —Isaiah 40:29

My Father Made the Stars

Every summer we're in Michigan when the Perseid Meteor Shower hits in August.

This year, I encouraged my two grandkids, ten and twelve years old, to come with me out to a dark area of our campground to watch for shooting stars. I brought a blanket for them to lie on and gaze at the sky. It was so satisfying to observe them as they, with great enthusiasm, spotted a few meteors zooming across the sky. They were impatient at first, but once they saw one, they kept their eyes peeled for the next one. I knew this would be another teaching moment about the Creator. Every time I see a starry sky, I can't help but worship the One who made it. Psalm 8:3, 4 says it so eloquently: "When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them?" Our Creator is all-powerful! He made everything that exists, and yet He loves each of us individually more than we can comprehend. This week's lesson reminds us of the power of God. The Scripture passage in Isaiah tries to paint a picture of His power, yet He truly is indescribable. And He's your heavenly Father—loving you, protecting you. He has your back. Can it get any better than that?

Creation Sights, Creator Insights

Our family enjoys traveling and seeing the creation of God. The mountains are always on our list of favorite places. My love of facts sometimes hinders my enjoying the fantastic view; while family members absorb the sight of the mountain, I am busy searching on my phone for facts to proclaim about the mountain. We live 114 miles from Denali, the highest mountain in North America. You can see the 20,310-foot mountain from 150 miles away in clear weather. The prophet Isaiah's directives imply that in pondering the majesty of creation, one learns more about the Creator. Pondering creation allows us to come to a proper conclusion regarding our place in it and our relationship to the Creator. Both involve "looking up" How long has it been since you did so?

<u>On Being Worn Out</u>

We recently discovered why God allowed us to have our children only when we were younger. It happened after we agreed to watch our grandson as his parents took a vacation. The two-year-old wore us out, mentally and physically! We love our grandchildren and cherish the time we spend with them. But whenever we're on "grandchild duty," we take a rest day from the gym—dealing with the youngsters is enough of a workout! God challenges us to remember him as the one who never tires and never needs to sleep. The creator of the universe holds the record for days without sleep! And he grants energy and knowledge to those who need strength and power when they are at the point of fainting. An issue during COVID was shortages. Issues with business closings and logistical limitations meant that goods were not as readily available as before. Stores ran out of things, even after limiting purchases per customer. Today's lesson reminds us that the God we worship and serve has never been subject to any kind of weakness, attrition, or scarcity in his resources. The prophet's affirmations of God's incomparable sustaining power and of his promise to provide strength to those who grow tired or weary have no expiration date. God's power and strength are indeed available to us today! The only restriction regarding our access to God's resources is our own sin and unwillingness to trust him.
